

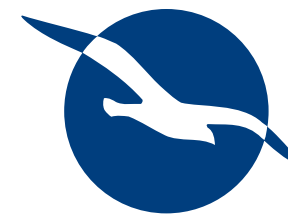
USGA RULES OF GOLF AND THE FOLLOWING LOCAL RULES WILL GOVERN PLAY.

- Staked trees are considered obstructions and relief, without penalty, from the tree or its basin must be taken (R.24-2).
- If a ball comes to rest in a flower bed, or the player's stance or swing is interfered with by the flower bed, the ball must be dropped, without penalty, as prescribed by (R.25-l).
- Out-of-Bounds is defined by the nearest inside points of white stakes with black tops, perimeter fencing, the nearest course-side edge of curb as marked as out-of-bounds. When both stakes and fencing are present, stakes will define the boundary (R.27).
 - A ball which crosses a public road defined as out of bounds and comes to rest beyond that road is out of bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course (Decision 27.20).
 - White stakes installed between the 4th and 5th holes define out-of-bounds during the play of hole #4. Such stakes are deemed to be immovable obstructions during the play of hole #5.
- Drop zones for holes #3 and #9 may be used for balls that enter water hazard.
- The waste bunkers left of holes #8 and #14 will be played as through the green. A player may ground his club and move loose impediments.
- The local Rule for Embedded Ball, as prescribed in Appendix 1 of the Rules of Golf, shall be in effect.
- The local Rule for Immovable Obstructions close to the putting green, as prescribed in Appendix 1 of the Rules of Golf, shall be in effect.
- Practicing is prohibited anywhere on the course.
- Repair divots, ball marks and any footprints in bunkers.
- Keep carts on the cart path where provided. Alternately, keep carts in the rough and observe the 90 Degree Rule when crossing the fairway.
- You are responsible for any injury to people or damage to property caused by your actions, including errant golf shots.
